

## PE and Sport Premium

### Primary school PE and school sport: new funding 2016/17

#### Background

1. In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for physical education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision.
2. Funding will be allocated to all maintained and state-funded schools with primary phase pupils, including: primary, middle, special and non-maintained special schools, academies and pupil referral units from 1 September 2013. A typical infant school will receive about £8,135 annually.
3. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

#### How will we be spending the PE and Sport funding this year and who will benefit?

The school has completed an audit of PE, school sport and physical activity to inform how we can further improve our provision. Feedback from the audit and from our staff have informed our decision to use the PE funding for the following:

Action	Success Criteria
Increase inter-schools sports opportunities.	Pay for transportation of children to a variety of sports events and festivals. Whenever possible, children will walk to events. 100% KS1 participation in inter-school festivals. <b>Approximate cost £500</b>
Provision of spare school PE kits.	All year groups to have spare PE and Games kits for those to use to be retained in school with the aim of school maintaining 100% participation. Even with our best efforts, the spare kit provided does become depleted. <b>Approximate cost £100</b>
Qualified coach to provide expertise in teaching PE and sport.	Coach to work regularly with all KS1 children. Teachers to continue to work alongside the coach to up skill and focus in on the assessment of the children. <b>Approximate cost £2500 (based on last year's costs).</b>
Tennis coach to provide tennis training.	Tennis coach to visit school and coach children in tennis skills <b>Approximate cost £500</b>
Qualified coach to provide two extra-curricular clubs.	Coach to continue to provide a lunch-time football club and an after-school multi-skills club to increase activity levels of children.
Further resources to be purchased to replenish PE stocks and outdoor PE area.	PD shed to receive further scooters at the request of the MDS and all PE stocks to be audited and replenished as required. <b>Cost TBA</b>
Investment in involvement with Chesterfield SSP.	Chesterfield SSP will support the school to provide more opportunities to involve our children in sport and the importance of a healthy lifestyle. See the following for a more detailed breakdown of what this means for our school. Core membership <b>Cost £950</b>
Training and cover for PE subject leader.	Subject leader to attend PE related courses and supply to be covered from funding. <b>Approximate cost £400.</b>
Provision of printed T-shirts for competition entry.	School to purchase a set of T-Shirts to include the school logo so that children have a sense of team, pride and belonging when

	attending PE events. <b>Cost TBA.</b>
Rugger Eds Training programme.	Children to be taught a new skill through a 6 week Rugger-Eds after-school programme. <b>Cost £360</b>

From the table above, you can see that we are investing some of our funding in affiliating to the Chesterfield School Sport Partnership (CSSP).
